



Location, Size & Other Background:

- Located in Nanticoke, Pennsylvania (28 miles southwest of Scranton)
- 34 acres – built on a “Brownfield” site (former coal mine) near the main campus
- Phase 1 opened in April 2008 at a cost of \$6 million

Ownership & Governance:

- Luzerne County Community College is the single-entity owner and operator
- The College is governed by a Board of Trustees who are appointed by the Luzerne County Board of Commissioners

Capital and O & M Funding:

- Capital – 20 year bond approved by the State Board of Education and the County Commissioners; College Foundation capital campaign; Grants; Local training association; Alumni association
- O&M – College budget has operations and maintenance line item. Revenue is derived approximately 33% from the State, 33% from the County, and 33% from student tuition

Government & Private Sector Entities Served by the Training Center:

- Fire
- Law Enforcement
- Emergency Medical Services
- Public Works
- Private Industry (Transportation; Private Security; Fire Brigade; Utility)

Programs & Courses Offered at the Training Center:

- Fire – Advanced and specialized skills courses for in-service Fire personnel; Basic Fire Academy; Emergency vehicle driver training; Haz Mat OPS; Trench rescue OPS;
- Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice – Emergency vehicle driver training; Highway incident scene safety; Legal concepts; Court room prep; Haz mat OPS;
- EMS – Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Basic and B; Advanced Life Support Paramedic; CPR; responder rehab
- Public Works – Confined space; Haz Mat awareness; vehicle driving
- Professional Truck Driver Program (tractor-trailer drivers) – Classroom training; practical range driving; practical road driving
- Private Security Courses – Lethal weapons basic and recertification
- Business and Industry – Training to meet OSHA and ISO requirements; safe driving programs; confined space and trench rescue training; hazardous materials/HAZWOPER

Props & Amenities Located at the Training Center:

- Modern classrooms with current A/V equipment
- 2 classrooms each seating approximately 32 people with tables/chairs or 50 people with chairs only. The classrooms may be opened up into one large room if necessary
- Computer Room – One classroom can be set-up with 15 laptop computers and a printer
- Drill grounds including vehicle fire and multi-fire outdoor propane-fueled live burn props
- Live Burn building – 3 story burn building with basement and 5 story drill tower
- Low speed driving area – Skid pad; maneuver pad; off-road area
- Confined space training area and props
- Firearms simulator
- Driving simulator
- Skid car system
- Maintenance shop
- Future phase will include an indoor shooting range

Outside User Facility Use & Fee Structure:

- Entities can arrange for use of the facility for their own training. They must submit a training plan along with the College's facility usage request form. The College requires at least one of their "resident instructors" on-site to provide for the safety of the user and to protect the facility assets. Nominal fees are charged depending on the type of training and number of resident instructors on-site
